Autumn Term 2025 – Year 4 Curriculum Newsletter

Welcome to Year 4

We hope you all had a good summer holiday! The children have an exciting and busy year ahead of them.

English

In English we will begin by studying poetic imagery and will begin to focus on writing related to our Neolithic history topic as well as reading the class text *The Wild Way Home*. The children will also be taking part in drama where we will be travelling back in time to the Stone Age using *Now Press Play*. Please note all children will soon have a home reader which needs to be read for 15 minutes each night. Please remind your child to independently change their books, when necessary, each morning when they come into class, we will also remind them. We are striving to develop independence this year.

Maths

Maths this term focuses on number work, problem solving and reasoning. We will work on the 4 operations, focusing on place value and tables. We will regularly use and apply the maths skills we learn, to investigate and solve problems. In addition, the children will be practising their times tables and we would encourage short, frequent practice at home (*Times Table Rock Stars* is great for this-let us know if any problems with log-ins etc. We are currently ensuring that all classes are updated to reflect the new classes so please bear with us).

Science

This term, we will explore electricity by identifying common electrical appliances and learning to construct simple series circuits using components such as cells, wires, bulbs, switches, and buzzers. Children will investigate how circuits work—predicting whether a lamp will light based on circuit completeness, understanding the role of switches, and identifying conductors and insulators, with a focus on metals as good conductors. Later in the term, we will explore states of matter by grouping materials as solids, liquids, or gases. Children will observe how some materials change state when heated or cooled and will measure or research the temperatures at which these changes occur. Finally, they'll explore the water cycle, focusing on evaporation and condensation and how temperature affects the rate of evaporation.

Computing

We will also be learning coding associated with controlling switches using 'Micro:Bits', as well as developing key computing skill such as word processing.

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This term our topic is the Neolithic. We have planned with Jersey Heritage, a visit to La Hougue Bie in September, where we will travel back in time to the Stone Age. Here we will be taking part in some 'hands on' activities including; grinding corn using Neolithic querns and making Neolithic shell necklaces. Our topic will extend to English tasks, computing and all aspects of our foundation curriculum.

Music

This term we will take part in an instrumental music project in partnership with the Jersey Music Service. The children will receive 10 weeks of class lessons, led by a specialist instrumental teacher. The instrument and lessons will be provided for 10 weeks free of charge, and the children will be expected to bring in their instrument each week and are encouraged to practice at home. 4J will begin their trumpet lessons on **Monday 22nd September** and 4L will begin their flute lessons on **Friday 26th September**. We will arrange a short performance for parents to enjoy at the end of the series of lessons.

PSHE

As part of our 'Jigsaw' PSHE lessons, we will be starting with 'Being Me in My World' and producing our own class charter in line with the UN 'rights of the child'.

RE

In RE, we will be looking at Christianity and Islam.

Art

We have planned a wide variety of art activities for the term. The children will begin to explore a variety of mediums including sketching, pastels and painting using various paints and surfaces. They will also be doing some clay work with pottery to link with our Neolithic topic. Aprons must be in school to avoid creating a very messy uniform!

French

Each class will have a session of French each week on a Friday, taught by Mrs Morrison. This term we will be revising greetings and salutations and talking about ourselves.

Alentou d'Jèrri – exploring Jersey's history, tradition, culture and language.

"Alentou d'Jerri" focuses on important historical dates and themes, going right back to when Jersey first became an island. We will also look at how Jèrriais evolved and how it has shaped some aspects of our island. We will learn about the influence of the Vikings, Romans and Normans in Jersey and will explore the history of the parishes, as well as some local legends and traditional tales. Mrs Parker will be running these sessions on Mondays, starting on Monday 15th September. We will also be taking part in a fun afternoon of 'Norman' games.

Homework

Homework each week will consist of reading (15mins per night) of their school reader, tables practice (on designated times table) and spellings (Set Monday for Friday). Spellings will be set electronically through Spelling Shed.
