### **Medicines in School**

Please note that we have strict guidelines to follow with regard to medicines in school and the administration of these. If a prescribed medicine is to be administered three times a day we ask that this is given by parents out of school. If your child has been prescribed a medicine four times a day, please contact the school office for further discussion and to complete a medical form.

If your child has a medical condition for example an allergy, asthma, diabetes, etc. please do come and speak with us. It is important that our medical records are up to date and where applicable, care plans drawn up and shared with staff. We will also discuss the storage and location of any necessary medication in school.

Any necessary medications must be brought to the school office by an adult.

We also ask that you let us know if any medical condition or information we hold on your child changes.

Well done to Isa, Emilia and Lily - who captured her artistic eye!


